



WORLD FOR WORLD ORGANIZATION (WFWO)

ASSESSMENT CHECKLISTS

In assessing both applications for grants and the reports that result from them, the World for World Organization (WFWO) will consider the following questions:

- How do the activities relate to:
 - WFWO's programme priorities and objectives of the relevant programmes;
 - WFWO's priorities and mandates;
- Is there a close fit with the strategic objectives of the WFWO ?
- What are the partnership links with other organisations, including the WFWO and other civil society organisations?
- In what strategic areas is the NGO or CBO working and what is the depth of this work ?
- Is there a strong gender dimension?
- Is there a strong youth dimension?
- In what regions is an NGO or CBO active?
- Are benefits being achieved for people in countries/developing countries ?
- What was the quality of outputs and outcomes of activity during the period?
- How are outputs and outcomes disseminated to the membership and public at large?
- How are programmes being developed? (e.g. what is the level of participation by the membership, especially by developing countries ?)
- Are efforts being made by the NGO or CBO to become self-sustaining ?
- Are good standards of organisational governance being adhered to ?
- How is accountability and transparency assured to the membership ?

In assessing financial reports, the WFWO will consider the following questions:

- Is the report accurate?
- Are WFWO funds properly accounted for as per the grant letter and what was actually contributed by the WFWO?
- How does the use of WFWO funds reflect the original application ?
- What does a comparison with last year reveal ?
- Has the NGO or CBO provided independently audited accounts ?

All activities supported under the programme will be expected to demonstrate impact.

In assessing impact, the WFWO will look in particular for the following:

- Existence of monitoring and evaluation processes;
- Ability of the NGO or CBO to measure and demonstrate impact;
- Evidence of clear results and follow-up in individual counties;
- Evidence that an organisation is taking on board the lessons of previous activities.
