Guiding Principles

The WFWO was founded on a set of principles (these are fully described in the below that guides everything we do - from governance of programs and grant-making:

Operate as an implementing NGO

The WFWO's purpose is to attract, manage and disburse resources to fight Poverty. And implement its programs directly, relying instead on a broad network of partnerships with other development organizations on the ground to supply local knowledge and technical assistance building capacity where required including: communities, CBO, NGO, government in developing countries.

Raising an additional resources mobilizations funds.

The WFWO is charged with raising large sums of money from its financial partner and supporters and through the establishment of its task force EBDRMT which neither replace nor reduce other resources to fight poverty and develop sustainable development programs focusing on: food security, health, drinking water, education and environmental issue. It addresses gaps in poor country efforts to fight poverty and strengthen underlying, food security, health, water, education environment and infrastructural systems by financing programs that complement those of other donors, and seeks to use its own grants to stimulate further investment by both donors and recipients.

Support programs priorities.

The innovative WFWO programs developed by the recipient countries themselves in line with national strategic plans and priorities focusing on MDGs. The and its Millennium Declaration requirement that all areas of society with a stake in sustainable development programs be involved in the development process, including civil society, CBO, NGO, communities, government and private sector, ensures strong and comprehensive programs.

Geographical intervention balanced in different regions

The WFWO gives priority to co-financing programs from poor countries with low income and high poverty burden and focusing on the eight MDGs objectives, though it will also consider programs from local NGO's, CBO's and communities. the WFWO's demand-driven approach ensures that the money is going where it is most needed.

Program approach and intervention

The WFWO takes a comprehensive approach to poverty eradications and health, drinking water, education ect, for funding and support programs based on locally determined needs.

Independent technical review processes

The WFWO's use of an independents external composed by Technical Review Panel Team and External Monitoring and Evaluation Team ensures that limited resources are invested in technically sound programs with the greatest chances of success. And results The panel includes technical experts, as well as experts in the field of development who are able to assess how proposed programs complement ongoing sustainable development programs efforts at the country level.

Grant operations guidelines and transparency

The WFWO holds its recipients and applicants accountable guidelines to strict standards that require programs to reach specific targets throughout the life of the grant. The public can track the progress of all grants via website and trough e-mail contact of the EBDRMT.
